Key Vocabulary

Capital Letter	Capital letters (also called upper case) are letters used at the beginning of a sentence and for a proper noun. Such as a name or place.
Full Stop	Full stops are used to end a sentence.
Adjectives	An adjective is a word that describes a noun (the name of a thing or a place). It was a terrible book. The word 'terrible' is an adjective. It tells us what the book (the noun) was like.
Noun	A noun is the name of a thing, such as an object, a place, or a person. Nouns are often described as naming words.
Conjunction	Conjunctions join together two different, but related, parts of a sentence. For example: I like swimming <u>and</u> she likes dancing.
