### School Response

6.	<p>My school deals with bullying quickly and effectively.</p> <p>7 children felt this was not the case. We try to combat bullying by talking about it in class, assemblies and anti-bullying week. Any reports of bullying are dealt with seriously by the class teacher and brought to the attention of the Head teacher where necessary. Some children say they are being bullied when however; it is a one-off case of unkindness. However, if you feel sad or worried about anything speak up. Most teachers have a worry box, in case you feel scared about telling someone.</p>
10.	<p>I understand the job of the governing body.</p> <p>A large majority of children did not understand the role of the Governing Body. In retrospect this is a strange question because the Governors' role is strategic and not to do with the day-to-day running of the school. This will be discussed with the GB as to whether an assembly is necessary or not.</p>
11.	<p>I regularly see governors visiting my school.</p> <p>A significant amount of children did not know whether Governors visit the school. They do but are not prominent on a day-to-day basis. For example, Miss Holman is involved in the ECO committee and does mental maths weekly with Y1/2. Father David comes in at least once a fortnight to lead worship. Mrs McFarlane talks to the children about safeguarding every month.</p>
18.	<p>At playtimes and lunchtimes, there are plenty of activities to do.</p> <p>We are working on this and I think it is improving. However, we have not managed to get around to all the playgrounds yet!</p>
