Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of our work in history, the children will be studying what being a child in Glossop was like in the past. As part of our work, we will be going on a local walk on **Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October** to observe how houses have changed in Glossop and look for other historical features.

Within the unit, the children will describe memories and changes that have happened in their own lives. In order for them to do this, we would like to invite the children to bring in a memory box from home filled with objects and photos of memories from their lives so far, e.g. baby outfits, holiday photos etc. They will share their memory boxes with their friends and order the objects/photographs in chronological order. **Please can these memory boxes be labelled with your child's name and be brought into school on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> October.** They will all be returned safely as soon as your child has had a chance to share them with their class.

They will also be comparing their school days with that of their grandparents. In order to do this, we will be sending home an interview sheet for your child to use to interview their grandparents or another older relative. It would be lovely if your child could look at old family photographs to look for similarities and differences between their school days and that of their older relatives. Your child will share what they have discovered with their class in a future history lesson. **Please can these be brought into school by Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> October.**
